

How to create a simple quiz in Moodle

Before you think about making quizzes consider why you are using them.

Are they formative quizzes that let students test their knowledge?

Do you want to assess student progress and understanding?

Do you want to use them as summative assessments?

Simple quizzes

There are 4 main types of simple quizzes:

- Multi choice with one correct answer
- Multi choice with more than one answer
- Matching (best used with images and text),
- True and false.

Getting started

1. Turn editing on.
2. Go to the topic area and **Add an activity or resource**.
