Before you add an image resize it.

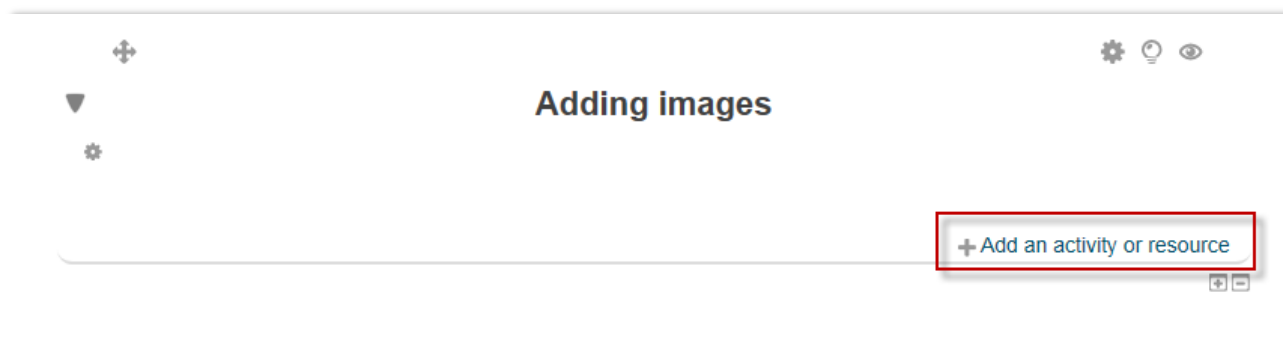
Use Paint, Fireworks or another image creating file (pixlr.com is a free online editing program). For a large image make it no bigger than 300 px wide and for smaller ones 64px x64 px is good.

See the **Designing: Editorial style guide** for suggested sizes.



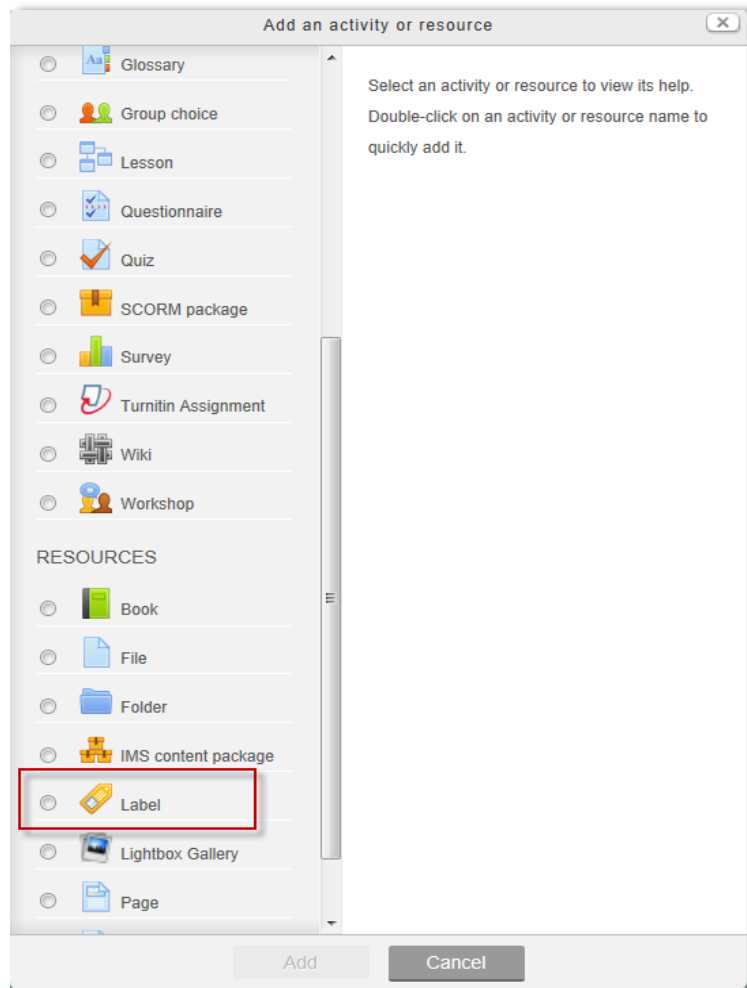
Then: With editing turned on...

1. Click + **Add an activity or resource**

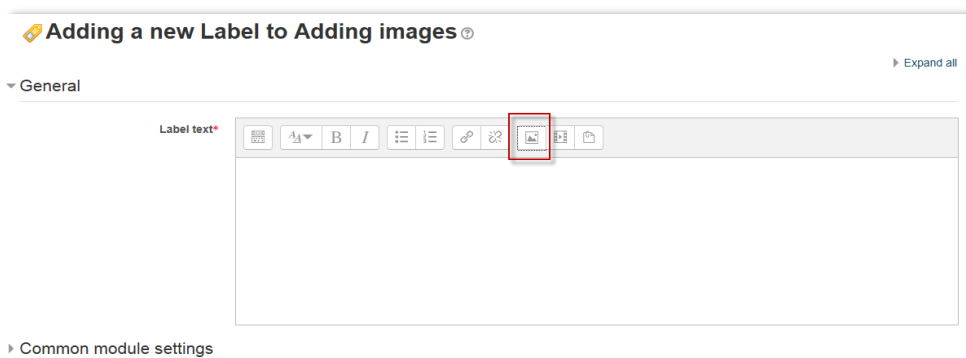


Images: Adding images to labels

4. Browse to your hard drive/image folder or choose from files already uploaded.

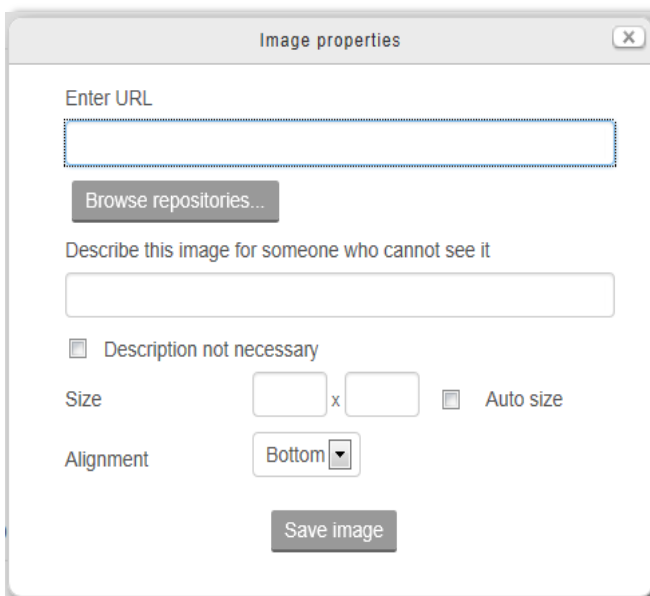
